Questions that may be asked

Scout MUST be wearing a Class A+ uniform.

1. Say the Pledge of Allegiance
2. Say Scout Oath.
(On my honor I will do my best ...)
Scout Sign - Your thumb and little finger touch to represent the bond that unites Scouts throughout the world. (see page 22 of Boy Scout Handbook)
3. Say Scout Law.
(A Scout is ...) (see page 24 of Boy Scout Handbook)
4. Say The Scout Motto.
(Be Prepared) (motto, two Ts like “Be Prepared” is two words)
5. Say The Scout Slogan.
(Do A Good Turn Daily) (S as in Spin around, turn)
6. Say The Outdoor Code.
(see page 28 of Boy Scout Handbook)
7. Scout handshake. (left hand, closer to the heart)
8. Explain the scout badge.
(see page 31 of Boy Scout Handbook, three points of the Scout Oath (duty to God, country (duty to others), duty to self), Shape - point the right way in life as a compass does in the field, two stars - truth and knowledge and camping outdoors, scroll - remember to smile when you do your duty, eagle with shield - freedom and a Scout’s readiness to defend that freedom (national emblem of the USA), knot - reminder to Do A Good Turn Daily)
9. Who started scouting? When? Where?
(Robert Baden-Powell, 1907, English Island of Brownsea, see page 37 of Boy Scout Handbook, and page 60)
10. How did scouting get to the US? When?
(William Boyce 1909 in London, see page 27 of Boy Scout Handbook)

11. When is the birthday of scouting for the US?
(Feb. 8, 1910) US Congress gave a charter on this date to BSA. This is why the Blue and Gold is in Feb., (see page 27 of Boy Scout Handbook)
12. What is Gilwell Park?
(scout training center outside of London, Baden-Powell gave the first Woodbadge course here.)
13. What is Philmont?
(National High Adventure Camp in northern New Mexico)
(see page 421 of Boy Scout Handbook)
14. What is Leadership? How have you shown it? (Shared leadership, a leader helps to make the group better, Leadership at home, school and troop)
15. Do you deserve your Eagle badge? Why? (Yes, I have done all of the requirements. I have lived by the Scout Oath and Law.)
16. Explain the Arrow of Light badge.
Seven rays of light, one for each day of the week. They will remind you to do your best as you follow the arrow that leads to Boy Scouting.
17. Order of the Arrow (OA) - Brotherhood of Cheerful Service (WWW)
(see page 425 of Boy Scout Handbook)
18. How will you payback leaders and your parents? (see page 428 of Boy Scout Handbook)
19. What was your favorite merit badge? What was your hardest merit badge?
20. What are your future goals? (college)
21. How have you shown Scout spirit? (I wear the scout uniform to all events, I help the younger scouts.) (see page 30 of Boy Scout Handbook)
22. What are two significant events in your life and why?
23. How did you do tonight? (I was nervous, but did a good job.)
